

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



KEEP OUR NEIGHBORHOOD FIREHOUSES OPEN

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Congratulations to members of Local 798 for their enthusiastic accomplishments at our Public Safety Rally on June 16th. The Membership showed in full force. The easiest way to determine that is to look at the overtime sign-ups for that day. Not one Firefighter, Medic, Lieutenant, Captain or Division Chief signed up for overtime. This is a reflection of the support, camaraderie and devotion Local 798 members have when it comes to keeping your neighborhood firehouse open.

The Rally was a huge success. Unfortunately we were not allowed into the Chamber of the Board of Supervisors, but they heard us. They heard loud and clear "Keep Our Neighborhood Firehouses Open! Make it a priority in the City and County of San Francisco!".

The recent Muni accident at the West Portal station reflects that as well. Ponder if engine companies were closed that day.

As you are all aware, it has been a very busy budget cycle. We as a union have been successful. Each firehouse is budgeted and is open. The Executive Board thanks the entire Membership for their productivity. We would not be in the position we are in without an active and aggressive membership. THANK YOU.

The 52-hour workweek that was proposed by a member of the Board of Supervisors is now off the ballot for this election cycle but it is something that we'll always monitor. This mystical form of budgeting where the City's financial problems fall on the shoulders of Local 798 is actually ridiculous and a poor form of government.

We have had serious injuries in the last 6 months at fires and we have asked the Administration for a formal investigation on each of those fires. Some of them have been investigated, while other requests have been completely ignored. We have taken an extra step and asked for outside transparent investigations into some of the most serious fires. For the life of me, I cannot understand why the Chief would not want to do an investigation. It just doesn't make sense; example: what has the Chief done with recommendations from Felton Street fire, where 6 firefighters were hospitalized?

We have recently presented to the Chief of Department, the idea of giving points for service on promotional tests. These points would reflect a firefighter's experience at fighting fires and medical emergencies, thus ultimately enhancing our profession. This was denied by the Administration, but why we are not sure. We are asking the Chief to walk a mile in our shoes here; to take a look at the big picture. Being that the mainstay of her experience in the SFFD has been administrative rather than active duty in fire suppression, we are simply asking her to get input from those with careers in fire suppression. Let's not be stubborn when lives are at risk. On a recent Battalion Chief's exam the majority of the test revolved around proper paperwork procedures. Each person that becomes chief of the SFFD attempts to put their stamp or agenda while in that job. Our current Chief's strengths are paperwork; thus the majority of the exam reflected on proper paperwork procedures.

If one were to look nationwide at large urban fire departments, one would discover that tests reflect fire scene and EMS components for scoring. I know the feeling of seeing that unwanted comma in Department paperwork drives me nuts. But I have yet to visit a firefighter in the hospital over grammar usage. Additionally, on a recent Lieutenant's exam, for some

Make no mistake, our benefits, wages, hours, firehouses, chiefs, operators and way of life in the San Francisco Fire Department will continually be under attack in the near future, and for years to come. We must stay pro-active and show a strong united front to push those who attack us back to where they belong!

The Chili Cook-Off is moving forward. Please call the Hall to sign up and get involved. Remember this event benefits our Toy Program which is by far our best PR! The contract ratification will be voted on by the membership in August. This is a very good deal especially in the City's current fiscal status – we are very fortunate to have such a great job in these uncertain times!

unknown reason, individuals with decades of service did not do well, yet individuals with one or two years of experience did fabulously well. Again, to me, something is wrong with the testing process when an experienced firefighter who has acted as a Lieutenant for say 10 or 15 years does not successfully complete the Lieutenant's test, but an individual with 1 or 2 years on the job is promoted. Don't get me wrong, I'm not saying that these people with 1 or 2 years are not qualified, but something happened with this recent Lieutenant's test where experienced firefighters did not receive a promotion. The SFFD Exam Unit promised that the test would be reflecting knowledge, skills, and ability!

Smile! You're on Candid Camera ... This is just the latest in what seems like an ongoing comedy of errors behind the hallowed walls of SFFD HQ. It is our understanding that members of the Arson Unit, unbeknownst to them, were captured on videotape while on duty and subsequent to that an investigation was initiated. At this juncture, we have been advised that all investigation has ceased and all members involved were exonerated by The Department of any wrongdoing. Local 798 is asking that letters be issued to each of the individuals involved, clearing them of any wrongdoing whatsoever. We are also requesting that the Administration develop a policy regarding the videotaping of Local 798 members by either The Department or by other employees of The Department.

Thank you for your time yesterday at the Labor Management meeting. At that meeting you said that you have not yet made a decision on the ballot measure increasing the firefighter work week to 52 hours.

Our position is that this ballot measure is clearly aimed at firefighters working in the field. No other occupation was named, no other City department is being asked to work a longer work week.

The question we have for you is, will you support the men and women of Local 798 and make a decision to speak out and forcefully fight this change in working conditions?





ARSONS SPREAD: 4 MORE CARS TORCHED IN S.F.

SAN FRANCISCO — Four more cars were set ablaze overnight in San Francisco, bringing the number of arson attacks since this weekend to a dozen, authorities said Wednesday.

The fires have cut through a wide swath of the city, and vehicles of all types have been targeted, from a Volvo to a Ford F-150 pickup. No arrests have been made in the fires, which have all occurred late at night or before dawn. Authorities don't even know if the same person is responsible for all 12.

The most recent fire happened about 3:25 a.m. Wednesday when a Honda was burned at La Playa and Balboa streets near Ocean Beach. The blaze charred a vehicle parked behind it.

A Porsche and an Infiniti were found on fire at Francisco and Powell streets in North Beach at 2 a.m. Another blaze happened at Newcomb Avenue and Selby Street in the Bayview about 11 p.m. Tuesday.

Wednesday's fires came a day after someone burned three cars and tried to torch a fourth on streets off of Geary Boulevard. Over the weekend and early Monday, there were four additional fires.

"It's very upsetting. We just hope it stops," Jamie Tapia, 38, said Wednesday, a day after her husband, who works with the state Employment Development Department, found his state-owned Chevrolet on fire near 48th Avenue and Geary Boulevard.

"It's not fair," Tapia said. "Hopefully, the police can do something, catch the people responsible for doing this."

The attacks are being investigated by an arson task force that includes San Francisco police and fire officials. Police say there is no direct evidence linking all the incidents, despite a number of similarities.

The arsons come as authorities continue to investigate a series of portable-toilet fires that began late last year. In some cases, the arsonist ignited outhouses with newspaper, authorities said. In one of the car-related incidents early Tuesday, someone saw a burning newspaper under a Ford truck, kicked it away and doused the fire with a water bottle.

The use of newspapers as kindling is a clue, said Candice DeLong, a former FBI profiler and psychiatric nurse.

"If I had a series of arsons only being started by a newspaper, that would be something I would consider in developing a personality and lifestyle sketch - i.e., a profile," DeLong said.

Both the car and toilet fires are considered "nuisance arsons," crimes that are typically committed by young people, DeLong said.

"They're not a nuisance to the owners, but compared to seeing a forest fire or an apartment building on fire, the nuisance-fire offenders tend to be those who are more on the youthful side, say their late teens or early 20s," DeLong said.

Arsonists typically strike in areas close to where they live or work, DeLong said.

It's possible, but not likely, that the arsonist has something against cars, she said. In 2005, Caltech graduate physics student William Cottrell, then 24, was convicted of a series of Los Angeles-area firebomb attacks of sportutility vehicles and car dealerships in the name of the Earth Liberation Front.

Investigators in the San Francisco fires will probably cast a wide net, she said.

"Could it be a homeless person? Yes," DeLong said. "Could it be an ecoterrorist? I suppose. But I rather doubt it's a hardened, middle-aged criminal."

Catalina Perez, 54, whose Volvo was one of two cars destroyed early Tuesday on Bertie Minor Lane in Japantown, figures "it's either someone who's a little crazy or kids that are out of control."

"School's out and they don't have much to do," Perez said. "They're completely unsupervised, if in fact it's kids."

Why is Getting Your FICO Score Important

Your FICO is not only used by financial institutions but can also be used to determine if you get a job, whether or not you can rent an apartment or qualify for insurance. The score itself is calculated from different types of data found in your credit report and is grouped into five different categories, with some categories having more impact on your score than others. PAYMENT HISTORY

Paving bills on time matters. It is one of the biggest measures used in scoring and the easiest to control. A "clean" payment history (no delinquencies) and lack of adverse public records (bankrupecy, wage garnishment, liens, etc) will have a positive impact on your

AMOUNTS OWED

A ratio of overall debt to available credit is one of the main factors in determining a score. Keeping that ratio lower than 75% is satisfactory but below 30% is better. Fewer accounts with balances, a lower proportion of credit lines used (not maxing out credit cards) and having paid down installment loans (auto loans, etc.) can keep the ratio in your favor.

LENGTH OF CREDIT HISTORY

score. Keep in mind that closing an unused credit card may work against you by increasing your debtto-credit ratio.

NEW CREDIT

Opening new credit accounts all at once, to lower a debt-to-credit ratio, or increase your overall available credit can work against your score -- lenders will submit inquiries to the credit reporting agencies and that activity will be noticed. The exception would be for those with payment history problems who need to re-establish credit history.

TYPES OF CREDIT USED

The number of accounts and the various types of accounts (credit cards, retail credit, auto loans, mortgages, etc.) will impact your credit acore. While it is considered generally positive to have established Accounts that have been open for long periods of accounts (as in credit history), too many accounts or frequent loans from some finance companies can


